Purpose

This **Guidebook** was written with two objectives in mind:

1. Create a path to disrupting the accelerating tech monopoly power consolidation that’s backing authoritarianism around the globe by reducing our use of their platforms and minimizing the way they can monetize our data.
2. Improve our mental health and safety by avoiding platforms with toxic algorithms lacking consumer protections, and moving our online activities to safer more ethical platforms.

Note: This document originally focused on Big Tech (& social media), but additional sections are evolving covering Big Media & News companies to avoid (e.g., Disney, Paramount, WSJ, NY Times) and other monopolies engaged in unacceptable business practices.

Exodus Rally Cry

*I'm not giving up, and neither should you.
They need us more than we need them.
They only have the power we gave them.
And we can take it back.*

We're watching the foundations of democracy, social justice, environmental sustainability, and truth itself fall away, and many people are asking, "What can we actually do?"

There's one concrete, overlooked step: → We migrate. We unplug. We reclaim our digital and economic power.

Big Tech companies (Meta, X, Google, Amazon, Apple) are not ethical platforms. They are actively profiting from division, addiction and misinformation. But they only have power because we give it to them. They actually need us (our data) more than we need them. And we can take our power back simply by walking away.

This is the most obvious, untapped leverage point we have.

Like the Last Alliance in the Lord of the Rings - *THIS* moment matters. We still have time. But not much. Let's move. Time is of the essence.

We don't need to part the river - we ARE the river.

Digital Exodus Overview

The Digital Exodus is a peaceful, strategic walkout from the **Big 5 Tech monopolies – Meta, X, Google (Alphabet), Amazon, Apple and now TikTok (owned by the Ellison Family which also owns Paramount and are pushing for privacy invasive surveillance)** that have embedded themselves in our daily lives and grown into monopolies with dangerous amounts of power.

What once felt like tools for connection have become the very infrastructure of addiction, manipulation, and social control. They've sold our data, eroded our privacy, stolen our IP, amplified division and now stand complicit in corporate-controlled governments around the world that are threatening democracy with misinformation, censorship and blacklisting.

This guide is your map out. It's not just about protecting yourself and your mental health; it's about building the next world with tools that encourage authentic connection, are free from algorithms, and respect our privacy. This movement is about taking back the power (attention, data and dollars) we gave away.

Why Does Migrating Off Big Tech Matter?

Taking Back Our Power

Because attention is power. Data is power. Dollars are power. And when we pull back, we:

- ***Weaken the monopolies*** fueling, supporting and accelerating authoritarian control
- ***Rebuild our collective voice*** and diversify the tools we use to connect and organize
- ***Disrupt the surveillance and behavior control infrastructure*** that has shaped public emotion and political thought for over a decade
- ***Shift power back into human hands***, where it belongs, an essential step for meaningful climate action and policy reform.

Every account you delete, every platform you migrate, every choice you make to break their control weakens the system — and strengthens the future we still have the power to create.

If enough of us pull away our attention from these apps and devices, even imperfectly, we interrupt their economic model and their influence pipeline. We reduce their power, and ultimately create an opening to influence what comes next.

Taking Back our Privacy

The Big Tech 5 — **Meta, X, Google, Amazon, Apple** (and now **TikTok**)— are pillars of the authoritarian system being built around us. The more you depend on their services, the easier it will be to:

- **Track and target you**
- **Control your physical movement**
- **Censor you**
- **Suppress your voice**
- **Blacklist you**
- **Block your access to resources**

Taking Back our Minds and Mental Health

These platforms don't just collect our data — they shape our thoughts. Curated feeds, algorithmic news, dopamine-driven notifications, and engineered outrage have hacked our nervous systems and hijacked our sense of reality. Studies have shown direct links between these tools and rising rates of depression, anxiety, and loneliness — especially among young people. Taking back our minds means reclaiming attention from manipulation, reconnecting with truth, and restoring the inner clarity we need to heal, resist, and build what comes next.

IMPORTANT NOTE:

The Digital Exodus is NOT anti-tech, nor about moral purity. It's about breaking the trance, taking our power back from the monopolies that have violated our trust, and reclaiming our privacy. It's about progress, not perfection. The goal is a reduction of 760-80% of use across these platforms. In numbers it all adds up.

Special Note for Influencers and Small Businesses

For influencers that make money off of ads on Meta, X, or YouTube; as well as business that get traffic from ads and reach - we understand this will take time. We are not asking you to sacrifice your livelihood. We know it may take you longer to exit the social media platforms. However, you can start changing other apps (Google, Apple, Amazon) now and then exit the others gradually (e.g., Facebook, Instagram, X, YouTube).

- If you have not already, start migrating your audience and customers to Substack and/or Patreon and invite them to be direct subscribers and supporters. This is a much more authentic business model. (Think HBO quality with its subscriber model vs. quality of regular network shows supported by ads.)

Look at it as diversification. It's OK if it doesn't all happen right away. But any movement is better than none, and movement means you are part of the Exodus.

Special Note for Investors

For those with big holdings in the stock market, we encourage you to divest from the Big5 and move to more sustainable options. If you want to stay in tech, consider smaller companies, or if you need to have a large cap, choose an alternative BigTech company as a stop gap solution.

TL;DR - The Basics

For those short on time and want to dive in right away, here are the basics.

1. **Move off toxic social media (priority #1):** Start with deleting or deactivating 5 out of these 8: *Facebook, Instagram, Threads, WhatsApp, Messenger, TikTok, Snapchat, and X* → Reconnect **on BlueSky, Mastadon, Pixelfeed, Substack, Signal, Zulip** or exchange emails and phone numbers. (**Linkedin and Discord** for safer mainstream platforms)
2. **Setup New Email Accounts** - Migrate from Gmail, if you can, to Proton, Mailbox, even Yahoo, AOL, Outlook are better for now.
3. **Switch search engines and browsers:** try DuckDuckGo, Firefox or Ecosia; Yahoo is better than Google Chrome
4. **Cancel Subscriptions:** Amazon Prime, Washington Post, Google/YouTube and Apple (News, TV, Music) subscriptions; (Media – Disney+, Paramount)
5. **Stop buying** new Apple products and buy refurbished if urgent. Note, we are not asking you to throw out your iPhone (yet), just stop new purchases, cancel any paid subscriptions & increase security settings so they can't passively make money off you.
6. **Delete the apps you no longer use off your phone** – Even if you aren't using the app, they collect data on your activity on other apps to sell to advertisers.

Digital Freedom Migration Map (Summary for BigTech)

One of the easiest ways to get a head start and stop their endless monetization of your private data is to delete as many of the apps off your phone, including Google Maps. They make money by tracking us, and we need to stop that flow of power away from us.

Below are alternatives for the Big 5 (Meta, X, Google, Amazon and Apple) + TikTok

Priority Migrations (If You Can Only Do a Few Quickly):

- Get off **Facebook/Instagram/X/TikTok** first. (Social manipulation = highest risk.)
- Migrate your **email** from Gmail to Proton or Tutanota.
- Switch your **browser** from Chrome to Firefox; Google **Search** to DuckDuckGo
- Shift **messaging** to **Signal** (as best you can and bring your friends over time).
- Stop using **Google Meet** and **Drive** -> Move to Zoom and Proton

*Freedom begins with **unplugging**. Even small migrations weaken their power.*

Remember – Progress not perfection. The goal is to aim for a reduction of 70-80% of use across these 5 platforms. In numbers it all adds up.

Big Tech/Social Media Migration Details

Social Media (Meta/X/TikTok)

Exchange **emails** and **phone numbers** before you leave Social Media platforms and set up new accounts before you move, for example:

- Create or join a **Discord** or Zulip service to move facebook groups to
- Join BlueSky and/or Mastodon and bring your friends.
- Replace WhatsApp and Messenger with **Signal**.
- Reconnect on **LinkedIn** for professional connections.

Bluesky (Decentralized Twitter/X Alternative)

-  <https://bsky.app>
- Decentralized protocol in development (AT Protocol)
- Built by former Twitter folks, focused on *transparency and portability*
- Smaller but growing quickly; Doesn't track users aggressively
- *Best for: users who want control over feeds, identity, and data in a decentralized ecosystem*

Mastodon (Decentralized Twitter/X Alternative, but more decentralized, a bit of learning curve)

-  <https://joinmastodon.org>
- Federated, open-source platform; No ads, no algorithm
- You choose your own "instance" (like joining a neighborhood instead of a country)
- *Best for: tech-savvy users or organized communities, less intuitive than Bluesky*
- Pick a server/instance that fits your interests (all connect to the same fediverse).
 - Good general-purpose instance: <https://mastodon.social>

CounterSocial (Twitter/X Alternative)

-  <https://counter.social>
- Privacy-focused social network designed to counter bots, trolls, and disinformation
- No ads or promoted content; user data is not mined or sold
- Stores minimal personal data — typically just the email used for signup
- Features include: self-destructing posts, private modes, polls, real-time news updates
- Owned by the anonymous hacktivist known as "The Jester" (central ownership)
- *Best for: privacy-minded users who want an ad-free, security-focused environment*

Upscrolled (Instagram/TikTok alternative)

- <https://upscrolled.com>
- Social media app launched in *June 2025*, focused on authentic expression and fairness
- Promises no shadowbanning, no biased algorithms, and equal **reach** for posts
- Emphasizes transparency, privacy, and human-led moderation
- Not decentralized yet — current open protocols don't meet performance needs, but interoperability is planned
- Offers photos, videos, text posts, stories, messaging, and trending content discovery
- *Best for: creators and communities seeking reach without heavy algorithm control*

Flashes (Instagram alternative)

- <https://www.flashes.blue>
- Photo/video-sharing app built on the Bluesky AT Protocol
- Filters a Bluesky feed to show primarily visual posts, Instagram-like experience
- Offers scrollable feeds, profiles, and photo filters
- Posts sync with a user's Bluesky account automatically
- *Best for: visual creators already active in decentralized ecosystems*

Pixelfed (Instagram alternative)

- <https://pixelfed.org>
- Decentralized, open-source photo-sharing platform powered by ActivityPub
- Ad-free with chronological feeds and strong privacy positioning
- Supports stories, messaging, albums, and filters similar to classic Instagram
- Built to connect with other [fediverse](#) apps like Mastodon
- *Best for: photographers and communities wanting an algorithm-light experience*

Loops (TikTok, YouTube shorts alternative)

- <https://joinloops.org>
- Federated, open-source short-video platform built for the [fediverse](#)
- Emphasizes creator ownership, privacy, and no ads or manipulative growth tactics
- Uses ActivityPub so content can travel across compatible platforms
- Designed as an ethical alternative to corporate short-video apps
- *Best for: creators seeking decentralized video without heavy data mining*

Minds (Facebook/Twitter hybrid alternative – general purpose)

- <https://minds.com>
- Open-source, distributed social network launched publicly in *2015*
- Rewards users with cryptocurrency tokens that can boost posts or support creators
- Designed to be more privacy-focused than many mainstream platforms
- Posts appear in *chronological* order instead of opaque ranking algorithms
- *Best for: users who want monetization options and open-source transparency*

Diaspora (Facebook alternative)

- <https://diasporafoundation.org>
- Nonprofit, user-owned distributed network made up of independently run servers (“pods”)
- Not controlled by single company, helps avoid corporate takeovers, advertising pressure
- Open-source software designed to give users ownership of their data
- Interface and feature set aim to provide capabilities similar to Facebook
- *Best for: privacy advocates who want maximum control over data*

Matrix + Element (Community & Chat alternatives)

- An alternative to Discord which is going to go public soon and therefore likely to become compromised by toxic “growth at all costs” model. (Remember, the idea is not to be perfect and pure. But to move off the biggest offenders first.)
- Open-source, decentralized messaging protocol
- Used by activists, journalists, even government orgs (for secure comms)
- *Best for: encrypted organizing, replacing WhatsApp, Discord if you want total privacy*

Signal (encrypted messaging app; replacement for WhatsApp and FB Messenger)

-  Download to your phone off the App store
- End-to-end encrypted, nonprofit-run; No ads, no metadata storage
- *Best for: private 1-on-1 or group messaging, organizing outside surveillance reach*

Discord (Community & Chat, FB Group alternative)

-  <https://discord.com/register>
- Create an account → Join or create servers for different communities.
- Free, invite-based community servers; Voice, video, text — no algorithm
- Some privacy concerns (owned by U.S. company, no end-to-end encryption), but no ad-based model → **May go public soon which will make this less secure.**
- *Best for: organizing, mutual aid, digital community hubs*

Zulip (Decentralized Group Chat / Threaded Slack Alternative)

-  <https://zulip.com>
- Open-source, privacy-respecting team chat platform; No ads, algorithm, or data mining
- Organizes messages into **threads within channels** — great for complex discussions
- This is for those who want cleaner sync discussion than Discord or Slack. *However, note that like the other threaded platform, it does not have E2E encryption.*
- You can self-host or use Zulip Cloud (free for small teams); Create your own “organization” and invite others; Each stream (channel) contains topic threads

Social Media Revenue Building Platforms for Artists and Writers

Patreon (site for creatives, alternative to Instagram)

-  <https://www.patreon.com/>
- Patreon provides a space for artists to sustain themselves by connecting them directly to their own communities with payment options for direct support from subscribers

Substack (site for writers, thought leaders and creatives, alternative to FB for people that use FB to share articles)

-  <https://substack.com/home>
- Like Patreon, Substack provides a space for writers (and artists but it’s focus is writing) to sustain ourselves by connecting us directly to our own communities with payment options for direct support from subscribers
- This is corporate VC owned and may become more algorithmically controlled

Note About Facebook Groups

Many long-time Facebook users struggle with leaving, less because of attachment to the posting and scrolling features, and more because of their ties in the Facebook Groups and Messenger chats. These are real communities, and it's understandable to feel resistance or overwhelm when presented with the idea of leaving Facebook.

Give yourself time to leave platforms like this. The first step is to join other platforms and then invite others and migrate over time.

For messenger groups move to Signal. For Facebook groups create a Discord or Zulip server instance. For more information on how to set up a Discord server visit: [Discord How To](#).

Here is a sample post of what you can share in your FB groups and messengers:

Hi friends. Meta is supporting policies that I can't stand behind and I don't feel right using their technology anymore. The algorithms have gotten more toxic over time and I rarely see friends posts in my feed anymore. It feels like it's all adds now. The only reason I'm still here really is for groups like this. I don't want to lose touch with you all. Is it possible to make a plan to migrate to another group platform to continue our discussions, perhaps over the next few weeks? Here's a link to one that I like <insert platform link>

Don't worry if the migration doesn't happen instantly. At least it's in motion, and, for a lot of us, it's something we've secretly been wanting for a long time.

Google/Alphabet Inc.

Google is one of the most complex webs to untangle from. This section includes tables and summaries of preliminary independent research, along-side images and table summaries from other organizations that have done deeper dives, organized their own migration plans, and created visuals.

Note for email: Another simply solution to get off Gmail quickly is to use your old Aol, Yahoo or Hotmail account. Remember progress not perfection.

Browser, Search and Maps Alternatives

DuckDuckGo (Alternatives for Google)

- No personal tracking, ad targeting, or filter bubbles
- Best for: web searches without profiling

Firefox, Brave (Alternatives for Chrome)

- Block third-party cookies, protect from fingerprinting
- Brave has built-in ad/tracker blocking + crypto incentives
- *Best for: replacing Chrome and Safari while maintaining usability*

YouTube Alternatives (hardest category to replace, but growing)

PeerTube

- (decentralized, no ads, open-source)
- Federated video platform, no algorithm control
- Still small, less discoverability — but safe for hosting educational, activist content

Odysee / Rumble / Vimeo

- Mixed bag: Some attract far-right audiences, some are artist-friendly
- Use with caution, depending on your content
- Best for: specific use cases, not mass movement spaces

- Delivery-use Instacart (has some ethical concerns, but allows vendor choice.)
- Food co-ops and farmers markets when possible.

- **TV:** Netflix and PBS are alternatives (also avoid Apple, Paramount, CBS, Disney, Hulu)
- **Music:** Tidal, Napster, Deezer, Soundcloud, (also avoid Apple Music, Spotify, YouTube)
- **Books:** Kanopy, local bookstore, local library; online: ebay, Barnes & Noble, Thriftbooks.com or Bookshop.org.

- **Pets:** Chewy, local pet store

Cancel Washington Post (owned by Bezos) - sign up for The Atlantic, The Guardian, The Lever.

Note for Merchants

You are not being asked to sacrifice your livelihood, but being to look at diversifying commerce platforms. Remember, progress, not perfection!

In general, try to delay unnecessary purchases, focus on spending in your local community, trade with friends, and rediscover that we don't need as much as we thought, which is a whole other liberation.



Apple

We are not expecting people to throw out their iPhones (yet). So here are some measures you can take to reduce their data collection in an act of Economic Resistance

Cancel paid Subscriptions

- Apple TV - cancel
- Apple News - Cancel and sign up for individual subscriptions or just read public news.
- Apple Storage - I don't know have a quick fix this one for those who have iPhones, but there are alternative ways to back up and store data; links - TBD
- Apple Music – replace with BandCamp, Soundcloud or Deezer (French); list of additional options [here](#).

Hold off on buying any new products unless absolutely necessary or buy refurbished.

Increase Security Settings

Reduce data collection and increase security on your iPhone so they can't monetize your data (details below). They make money off of every data point they collect and we need to stop that now. Apple seems to have better respect for privacy than Meta and Google, but it's still part of the unhealthy monopolistic surveillance system.

Ways to update Apple Security Settings

1. Turn Off Location Tracking Where You Don't Need It

- **Settings > Privacy & Security > Location Services**
 - Turn off **Location Services** entirely or review app-by-app.
 - Scroll down to **System Services** and turn off most of those (especially: *iPhone Analytics, Significant Locations, Routing & Traffic*).

2. Disable Apple's Ad Tracking

- **Settings > Privacy & Security > Apple Advertising**
 - Toggle **off Personalized Ads**

3. Stop Sharing Analytics with Apple

- **Settings > Privacy & Security > Analytics & Improvements**
 - Turn **everything off** here (especially *Share iPhone Analytics, Improve Siri & Dictation*)

4. Limit App Tracking (This Affects Facebook, Instagram, TikTok, etc.)

- **Settings > Privacy & Security > Tracking**
 - Toggle **off Allow Apps to Request to Track**
 - Also turn off tracking for any individual apps listed

5. Turn Off iCloud for Non-Essentials

- **Settings > [your name] > iCloud**
 - Disable syncing for stuff you don't want backed up to Apple's servers (e.g., Photos, Notes, Safari)

6. Turn Off Siri & Dictation Data Collection

- **Settings > Siri & Search > Siri & Dictation History**
 - Tap *Delete Siri & Dictation History*

- Then go to **Settings > Privacy & Security > Analytics & Improvements** and make sure Siri data sharing is off.

7. Block Tracking in Safari

- **Settings > Safari**
 - Turn on *Prevent Cross-Site Tracking*
 - Turn off *Preload Top Hit*
 - Set *Search Engine* to DuckDuckGo (or Ecosia if you want a sustainable option)
 - Toggle off *Safari Suggestions* and *Search Engine Suggestions*

8. Use Minimal Apple ID Features

- Avoid using **Sign in with Apple** where possible
- Consider using **anonymous email aliases** (Apple lets you do this with some logins)

9. Disable Bluetooth/Background App Refresh Where You Don't Need It

- **Settings > General > Background App Refresh** → Turn off or set to *Wi-Fi only*
- **Settings > Bluetooth** → Turn off for apps that shouldn't need it

10. Consider Turning Off iCloud Backups Entirely (Advanced)

This gives you *maximum control*—but you'll need to back up manually via computer if needed.
Remember: progress not perfection. The goal is to try to reduce use by 70-80%

Alternative to iPhone (and Google Android) (HW, O/S)

Murena

- Alternative smartphone runs on non-Google, non-Apple hardware.
- Devices run on /e/OS, an open-source, privacy-focused operating system that removes Google's proprietary components, aiming to provide users with greater control over their data.

K-iPhone

- A modified iPhone with the K Secure OS overlay, built by EFANI and KryptAll.
- Focused on military-grade encryption, anti-eavesdropping, and secure calling.
- Comes with EFANI's secure SIM plan, which includes SIM swap protection, encrypted routing, and anonymous mobile service.

Graphene O/S

- Privacy- and security-hardened Android OS built on the Pixel hardware platform.
- Open-source, developed by security researchers. Removes all Google services and adds advanced protections against tracking, exploitation, and surveillance.
- Best for users who want maximum control, anonymity, and resilience in a hostile digital environment.

Other Tech Companies

TikTok

TikTok has become a red alert platform after coming under control of tech media giant, Oracle. TikTok, like Instagram Reels and Youtube Shorts, do not have great alternatives yet. Peertube is the best substitute Youtube, while Pixelfed is an image sharing platform like Instagram.

Between TikTok and Instagram, it looks like Instagram is the better of the two right now in terms of safety and behavior manipulation.

Uber

Uber Transportation Alternatives

- Try **Lyft** (less connected to the authoritarian regime), a **local taxi**, or better yet, walk, bike, or use public transit when possible.
- In some areas, apps like **Curb**, **Via**, **RideCo**, or even worker co-ops like **Co-op Ride** in NYC offer better-aligned options.

Uber Eats Alternatives

- **Chow Now** – commission free, supports local restaurants directly. App reach is smaller.
- **Toast TakeOut** – Build for restaurants, lower fees; smaller reach, mostly pick up
- **Local Restaurant websites and direct Phone orders** – Many restaurants don't have their own delivery anymore, but for those that do, this is an option - money goes to restaurant; slightly less convenient but much more impactful
- **DoorDash** – not ideal, but somewhat less exploitative than Uber. Better terms for restaurants.

Spotify, AirBNB, Booking.Com

These companies are known for their complicity in wars abroad.





- **Warner Bros. Discovery** (CNN, HBO, DC)
- **Fox Corp.** (Fox News, Fox TV)

News, Reporting, Journalism Outlets

Cancel Subscriptions to:

- Washington Post (owned by Amazon)
- New York Times (normalizing authoritarianism and corporate corruption)
- Wall Street Journal (normalizing authoritarianism and corporate corruption)

Most mainstream news these days is corporate owned. This includes places like Bloomberg and Financial Times. Even if they report accurately, it's often framed in a way that misses important info and keeps us in the dark. An example would be the way climate change is discussed. Focusing on "risk" and technocratic solutions rather than on the actual devastation that's going to be experienced by the global south and mass migration we are already seeing now.

Mainstream, Widely Trusted Non-Profit / Public Service News

Some nonprofit sources of news are better options, though they can still be constrained.

- Associated Press (AP) - Independent, non-partisan news cooperative with global presence.
- Reuters - International news agency known for fact-based reporting (not nonprofit but highly trusted)
- NPR (National Public Radio) - U.S. nonprofit public radio network with careful editorial standards.
- The Guardian

Nonprofit & Investigative Journalism

These focus on in-depth reporting and public-interest journalism:

- **ProPublica** – Nonprofit investigative newsroom. [ProPublica](#)
- **FactCheck.org** – Nonprofit fact-checking project. [Berkeley Library Guides](#)
- **Institute for Nonprofit News (INN network)** – Network of hundreds of independent nonprofit outlets; includes many local outlets.

Other notables

- **Correctiv** – German-based nonprofit investigative newsroom.
- **OKO.press** – Polish nonprofit investigative site focused on transparency.

Independent News (Established, but more Opinionated or Niche)

These outlets are independent and often more willing to critique powerful institutions. Some blend reporting with commentary; use them with awareness of perspective.

- **Truthout** – Nonprofit focusing on social justice issues (explicit perspective).
- **Mediapart** – French independent online newspaper funded by reader subscriptions (nonprofit trust).

Small, may lean politically in one direction but deep investigative, independent of corporate ownership and strong supports of democracy and human rights.



Toxic Monopolies

Most of the companies mentioned so far are considered monopolies complicit unlawful military, surveillance and genocides at home and abroad. Generally speaking, Big Tech, Media, Pharma, and Energy companies are some of the most complicit in human right violations, the dismantling of democracy and growing inequality. However, giant corporations, in general, are anathema for human survival.



Additional Big Business to Avoid, if possible

Not all of these are individual customer facing (like intel, Palantir and oracle) so harder to control the use of.




Figure 1: Alternative Tech Reference Guide: EU Digital Independence Map




